Position Report

For the second month in a row, shipments have out paced last year's numbers for the same period. Total shipments for April increased by 12 million pounds over last year's 58.1 million pounds for a total of 70.1 million pounds. That brings the total shipments for the 2005-06 crop to 693.7 million pounds, down 12.8% (102.1 million pounds) from last year. Shipments have gained 7% in the last two months. Assuming shipments are at least equal to the final three months of last year our industry carryout would be a manageable 125-130 million meat pounds.

Market Update

The market continues to firm on both current and new crop prices, with current crop prices increasing at a faster pace. Buyers are now concerned with tightening supplies and the possibility of a late harvest. The result means buyers are extremely motivated to contract to cover their needs for a smooth transition into new crop. This activity is pushing up prices. Where it stops is hard to predict in view of what happened this past year, coupled with the weakening dollar.

2005 Pool Final

Following consistency in recent years, we will announce our final Pool prices in the June newsletter. We are confident our prices will be competitive. Final payments will be mailed out to growers on Monday July 10th.
